A MESSAGE FROM MOTHER PIPPA



Dear St. Mary's Parish,

This Sunday is the start of October – I cannot believe that we are so far into the year. Today is also our annual Pledge Sunday, so please turn in your pledge cards during the Pledge Ingathering in today's service. We start our budgeting process after we receive our pledges because our pledges make up over 90% of our income for the year. Costs are rising, but I am grateful for your support as we continue to work together in joy and ministry.

Our calendar has all kinds of events. On Saturday, October 7, we are joining St. Francis, Menomonee Falls for their Pet Blessing. We are also sending volunteers to the Gathering at Ascension Lutheran Church.

St. Mary's is welcoming the wider community to Prayers & Picnic on the Prairie on Sunday, October 8 at 9 AM. There is a sign-up sheet for the potluck as well to help with set-up in the Parish Hall. I hope you will join us and bring your friends and family as we bless the prairieland and celebrate the natural beauty of Wisconsin.

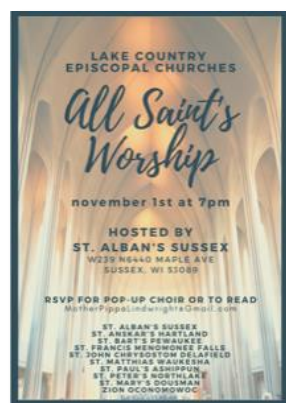

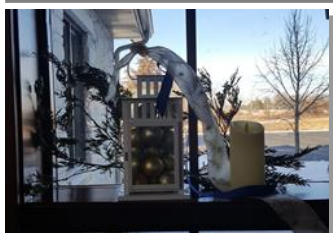
